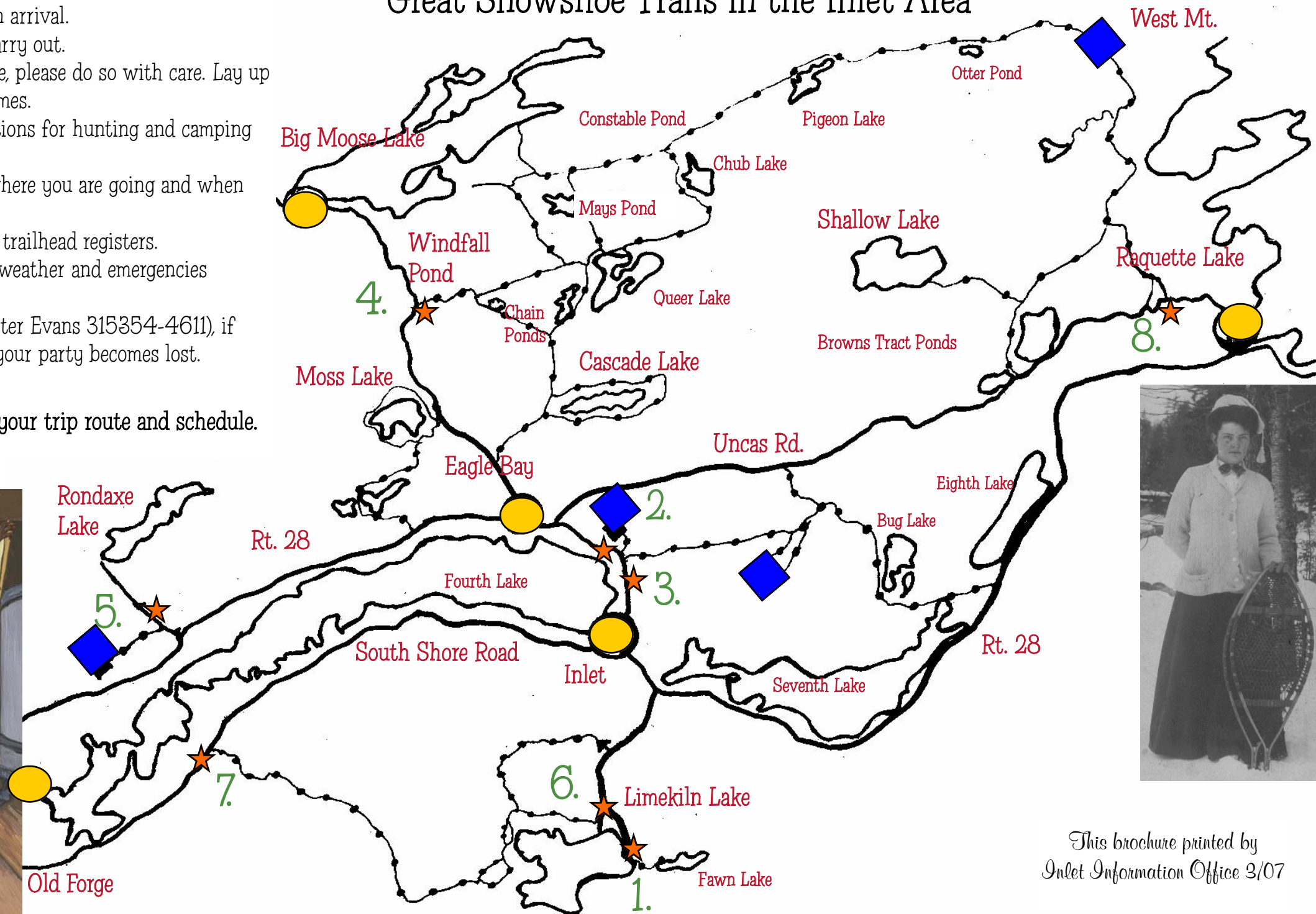


- More Detailed maps can be purchased from many of the local stores in the Inlet area on arrival.

- Fires – If you must build one, please do so with care. Lay up stones and attend it at all times.
- Observe all rules and regulations for hunting and camping in the State of New York.
- Always let someone know where you are going and when you will return.
- Sign in sign out of all D.E.C. trailhead registers.
- Be prepared for unexpected weather and emergencies

Notify the local forest ranger Peter Evans 315354-4611), if long term camping or if one of your party becomes lost.

Always inform someone of your trip route and schedule.

## Great Snowshoe Trails in the Inlet Area

All directions to trailheads are given from the Inlet Town Hall where the Inlet Information Office is open every day for weather advisory and advise on route.

#### 1. Fawn Lake From Parkhurst Road

Travel North on Rt 28 3/4 Mile To Right Hand turn on Limekiln Road, travel 2 miles to left hand turn on Parkhurst road. 3/4 mile Park at the dead end parking turn around the trail head is 1/16th of a mile from the far left driveway on the left. The trail is flat and easy 3/4 of a mile in length and 1 1/2 miles round trip. Trail winds through beach forest and opens up on to a small mountain lake. This lake freezes early but caution must be taken if you wish to explore the frozen surface.

#### 2. Rocky Mountain from Route 28

Travel 3/4 mile South, the trail head is on the right this parking area is the same for both Black Bear and Rocky Mt. This is an easy 1/2 mile climb to the top with very little areas that will ice cover. The views from here for sunset and sunrise as made with head lamps can be spectacular.

#### 3. Black Bear Mountain from Route 28

Travel 3/4 mile South, the trail head is on the right this parking area is the same for both Black Bear and Rocky Mt. This trail is intermediate and 2.3 to 2.5 miles in length. As this trail

has a steep ascent from the first Y on the right (Blue )trail and a intermediate ascent on the second right Y to the Top.

#### 4. Windfall Pond and Great Eight

Lakes from Big Moose Road South on Rt. 28 1 mile to Eagle Bay center then a Right on Big Moose Road 5.3 Miles to Trail Head Parking Lot for Windfall Pond On The Right. This trail is easy to Intermediate and is only 1.2 miles to Wind fall, then 2.3 to Chain Ponds. Larger Loops can be made to Mays Pond 4.5, Chub Lake 5.1, Constable Pond 5.4, Pigeon Lake 8.7 Otter Pond 12.4 Miles. All intermediate.

#### 5. Rondaxe (Bald) Mountain from Rondaxe Road

Travel south on Rt. 28 6.2 miles to right hand turn on Rondaxe Rd. Travel 1/8th mile to trailhead parking on left. Trail is 2.0 miles to the summit This is upper intermediate and has some areas on the hogs back that can ice over.

#### 6. Limekiln Campground and Old Dam Nature Trial From Limekiln Lake Road

Travel North on Rt 28 3/4 mile to right hand turn on Limekiln Road. Travel 2 Miles to campground road on

Right. Parking is here at campground entrance. This system of roads are shared by snowmobile cross country ski and snowshoe's alike but see little if any use. This is easy and has some 6.7 miles of winding loops along the road surface, and connections to the old dam Nature trail loop near camp site 98 on the back side of the Leach field for another 1.3 mile loop. And also access to Third Lake Creek Trail.

#### 7 Third Lake Creek Access Trail From South Shore Road

Travel forty yard north on Rt 28 to right hand turn on The South Shore Road travel 7 miles to the Parking area for Third Lake Creek Trail on left. This trail is Long 9.1 miles to Limekiln but fairly flat.

#### 8. West Mountain Shallow Lake From Raquette Lake Village

Travel north on Rt. 28 10 miles to left Hand turn to Raquette lake village to Antlers Road park at the Trail Head for West Mountain Steep Difficult 5.2 Miles to Mt. With very little view, Loop Trails to Shallow Lake 6.3 and Browns Tract Pond. 3.1 and Trail to Wind Fall Pond Big Moose Road 17.4 Miles
